A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

As CEO of Cody Regional Health, I'm proud to share our Fiscal Year 2025 Annual Report—a reflection of the progress we've made, the purpose that drives us, and the people shaping healthcare in the Big Horn Basin.

This past year brought meaningful growth as we expanded clinical services, increased access to specialized care, and continued enhancing the patient experience through Planetree's person-centered care model. From launching our Patient & Family Advisory Council to improving communication, comfort, and compassion at the bedside, we remain committed to treating every person with dignity and respect.

We also invested in the future of local healthcare through expanded Emergency Medical Services, a new ambulance,

and major technology upgrades including a new MRI and Linear Accelerator. Across Surgical Services, Emergency Medicine, the Cancer Center, Outpatient Therapy, and Behavioral Health, our teams continue to lead with skill, innovation, and heart.

Beyond our walls, we strengthened community health through school-based education, outreach efforts, and perception surveys that help us better understand local needs. We are deeply grateful to our donors and Foundation partners whose generosity made many improvements possible.

Looking ahead, we remain focused on thoughtful growth, strong operations, and strategic investments that ensure Cody Regional Health continues to thrive as an independent regional health system—guided by our mission and one simple truth: our care is personal.

Our Planetree Journey

Advancing Person-Centered Care Through

Planetree Cody Regional Health continues to strengthen its commitment to person-centered care through our Planetree journey—an internationally recognized model focused on compassion, collaboration, and partnership with patients and families.

In 2025, CRH welcomed a dedicated Planetree Coordinator, JD Poeverlein, to help advance this work across the organization. Support from senior leadership and the Organizational Culture Council has reinforced Planetree as a shared priority across all levels of CRH.

Progress Toward Planetree Bronze

Certification In March 2025, the Organizational Culture Council conducted a comprehensive review of CRH's progress toward Planetree Bronze Certification, with a goal of achieving designation by the end of 2026. Through this process, nine key drivers were identified as essential to reaching Bronze. By November 2025, seven of those drivers had been completed, with the remaining two nearing completion. CRH plans to formally begin the certification process in February 2026.

Partnering With Patients and Families A cornerstone of this work is the Patient and Family Partnership Council (PFPC), which meets monthly to provide guidance on person-centered initiatives from the perspective of patients and families. Their insights help ensure care at CRH not only meets clinical standards, but reflects the voices and experiences of those we serve. Expansion of the council in 2026 will further strengthen community connection and engagement.

Looking Ahead As CRH moves toward Planetree Bronze Certification, our commitment to person-centered care remains strong and growing. The progress achieved in 2025—and the momentum building for 2026—reflect a unified belief that exceptional healthcare happens when patients, families, and caregivers work together. Cody Regional Health is proud to lead this effort for our region, continuing to enhance how care feels, functions, and supports our community.



Expanding Our Reach, Elevating Our Care

At Cody Regional Health, our Emergency Medical Services (EMS) team continues to go the extra mile—literally and figuratively. In 2025, our EMS department expanded coverage into Hot Springs County, increasing our service area to more than 13,000 square miles across four counties, including two gateways to Yellowstone National Park. Our crews include more than 75 highly trained paramedics, advanced EMTs, and EMTs ready to respond at a moment's notice.

This year alone, our ambulances traveled over 260,000 miles (an average of 842 miles per day)—a powerful testament to our commitment to rural and regional emergency care. With the addition of a new fully equipped ambulance and advanced medical equipment—including Hamilton T-1 ventilators, GE portable ultrasounds, and New IV Pumps for trauma response—we are better prepared than ever to deliver lifesaving care in the field and during interfacility transfers.

We strengthened partnerships with First Flight of Wyoming to improve access to

rapid air transport and participated in multi-agency drills and mass casualty simulations with regional emergency responders.

From expanded coverage and advanced training to faster response times, our EMS team embodies our mission: delivering extraordinary healthcare—anywhere, anytime.

At Cody Regional Health, innovation isn't about keeping pace—it's about leading the way. This year, we invested in major technology upgrades and facility improvements to expand access, elevate safety, and ensure our community continues receiving the highest level of care close to home.

These advancements support our long-term commitment to delivering exceptional patient outcomes, improving provider capabilities, and strengthening the overall healthcare experience for the Big Horn Basin.

MRI Upgrade This year, Cody Regional Health completed a full replacement of our previous MRI unit, introducing a state-of-the-art GE Signa Artist Evo 1.5T system designed to dramatically enhance image quality, speed, and patient comfort.


- Faster scan times, allowing for a more efficient patient experience and increased scheduling capacity.

- Our upgraded MRI launched December 2025, marking a major step forward in imaging.

Impact for Our Community

- The Big Horn Basin Cancer Center treats 100-130 patients each year, many of whom previously would have traveled long distances for advanced therapies such as SRS and SBRT. The TrueBeam dramatically improves access by enabling faster treatment times and opening the door to more precise, highly targeted care—right here at home.
- This investment represents our continued commitment to bringing the best in cancer treatment technology to the region we serve.

New Linear Accelerator

This year, the Big Horn Basin Cancer Center reached an exciting milestone with the installation of the Varian TrueBeam® Linear Accelerator, replacing our previous radiation therapy system. This state-of-the-art technology dramatically enhances precision, safety, and efficiency—strengthening our ability to deliver world-class cancer treatment close to home.

The New System Provides

- Speed & Efficiency
- Intelligent automation shortens treatment times.
- High-dose delivery significantly reduces “beam-on” time, improving comfort.

- Advanced Precision
- Dose accuracy improves to $\pm 0.2\%$ (compared to $\pm 3\%$ with older systems).
- Enhanced geometric/spatial accuracy enables tighter tumor targeting.
- Lower variability across machines supports consistency in treatment delivery.
- Enhanced Imaging & Workflow
- A fully integrated imaging system replaces three older workstations—streamlining alignment and supporting real-time decision-making.
- Multiple photon and electron energies expand therapy options.

Seedlings Center Relocation & Expansion

We know that exceptional patient care begins with supporting the people who provide it. Our Seedlings Center—offering on-site childcare for CRH employees—has been a cornerstone of that commitment since 2007. This year, we began the relocation and expansion of the Seedlings Center to create a more functional, spacious, and developmentally supportive environment for children ages birth through pre-kindergarten.

- Modernized design elements that reflect the compassionate, family-centered approach our team is known for




Honoring Excellence
