

2018–2019 REPORT TO OUR COMMUNITY



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

CODY CARDIOLOGY CENTER

Cody Regional Health partnered with Billings Clinic last year to expand cardiology services to Northwest Wyoming. With planning behind us, the new Cody Cardiology Center is open for business and includes a Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory (Cath Lab). The Cody Cardiology Center Cath Lab is located at our main West Park Hospital Campus and our cardiology physician clinic is located at our Cathcart Health Center Campus.

Our Cody Cardiology Center includes the newest X-ray technology systems allowing our physicians to merge different imaging modalities to guide procedures including new high-end, real-time 3D imaging. This provides us the ability to perform diagnostic and interventional cardiac catheterizations to diagnose and treat heart disease.

Procedures that are being performed at the new Cody Cardiology Center include: cardiac catheterizations, pacemaker placements and defibrillator placements. Billings Clinic is providing interventional cardiologists monthly to complement services. The partnership with Billings Clinic brings the most comprehensive heart and vascular program to the Big Horn Basin region with a team of general and interventional cardiologists.

ZERO SUICIDE INITIATIVE

New processes saving lives and directing those with mental health issues to the right help.

In 2017, Cody Regional Heath joined the ZEROSuicide state initiative by putting together a specialized work committee. This committee was made up of hospital personnel from our Emergency Department, Behavioral Health, Prevention and Information Technology. Members of the community also joined in this effort from law enforcement, the school system, Yellowstone Behavioral Health and others who had an interest in the cause.

The ZEROSuicide Initiative is a nationally recognized program that focuses on a system wide approach to identify and provide services for those at risk for suicide. Statistics have shown that 83% of people who died by suicide saw their health care provider in the year before their death. Only 29% of those who died in the past year were seen in an outpatient behavioral health setting.

Our team has been working through the ZEROSuicide toolkit to implement this organization wide and within our community. Our goal is that anywhere a patient presents for healthcare within our system, they are screened appropriately according to best practices. This screening uses the


PHQ-2 and PHQ-9 questionnaire. The questionnaire provides a numerical value which can then be correlated with a depression severity. Based on the depression severity, clinical staff discuss resources in the community and can set up a referral for the patient so they can receive the right help.

The Emergency Department at Cody Regional Health started using this process in January 2018. To date, they have over 80 referrals to behavioral health for patients who were at moderate risk. Testimonials from patients have said that by asking the questions and talking to them about resources, they were able to get the help they needed. These were patients who are not presenting for depression or suicide in the emergency department, but rather there for another illness.

The Walk-in Clinic at Cody Regional Health as well as the OB/GYN Clinic and Internal Medicine Specialty Clinic are all asking patients during their visits to help identify those patients who may need help, but would otherwise not seek

help on their own.

Yellowstone Behavioral Health is also actively involved with the Zero Suicide Committee. Yellowstone Behavioral Health counselors are available 24 hours a day and are consulted when patients may need immediate help. We look forward to growing this approach to show how this initiative makes a major impact on the lives of our patients in the Big Horn Basin Region and beyond.

INTERNAL MEDICINE PRIMARY CARE



Cody Regional Health offers primary care access at the Cathcart Health Center. Our Internal Medicine Specialists are here to take responsibility in providing a patient's comprehensive care. Our primary care providers are trained to focus on the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of chronic adult diseases. Bringing a comprehensive approach and a broad knowledge of disease types, our providers emphasize health education, appropriate screenings and prevention in addition to acute and chronic illness diagnosis and management.

Complimenting services is Pharmacist, Ben Patrick. Ben is available to provide Coumadin management, medication education and medication reconciliation. Ben helps the primary care providers to optimize your medication regimes so you are getting the most out of any medications you may be prescribed.

The Internal Medicine Specialists also include Liz Fabrizio, MSRDN, CDE, BC/ADM, a diabetes management and education provider. Liz provides services in the Internal Medicine Suite 230 at the Cathcart Health Center on a weekly basis.

When your primary care physician is not available after hours or on weekends, our Walk-in Clinic also at the Cathcart Health Center is there for you. The Walk-in Clinic providers are able to support your acute care needs with communication and follow up returned to your primary care physician.

Our providers work as a team to coordinate your medical care by:

- Providing preventative care services
- Diagnosing and managing new medical conditions
- Managing chronic conditions
- Coordinating care with medical and surgical specialists
- Performing complete physical examinations.
- Performing DOT certifications and physicals

Cody Regional Health continues to offer free training opportunities for our communities. This last year we partnered with Powell Valley Healthcare to create "Park County Heart Rescue!" Our goal was to train 500 community members in one year in "Hands Only" CPR. We'd like to report we've trained over 1,000 members in Park County and are going strong!
